What is SPIRIT?

SPIRIT is a research study for cancer survivors who are overweight. Studies suggest an association between excess weight and cancer, but we don't know why. For this reason we are conducting a research study on weight loss and a common medication that might affect the risk of cancer recurrence.

In some studies, a hormone produced by our body (IGF-1) is linked to tumor growth. Higher levels of this hormone are associated with increased risk of cancer growth.

Weight loss through diet and exercise might lower this hormone (IGF-1).

Metformin, a medication commonly used to treat patients with early type 2 diabetes, might also lower this hormone (IGF-1).

You may be eligible to join if you:

- Are a cancer survivor
- Are overweight and willing to lose weight
- Are not taking diabetes medication
- Have regular access to the internet and an email account
- Can attend clinic visits at Johns Hopkins Pro-Health Clinic in Gwynn Oak.

What is involved in SPIRIT?

You will be randomly assigned to one of the following three groups:

- Self Directed Weight Loss
 You will receive written materials about weight loss.
- 2) Behavioral Weight Loss
 You will work with a health
 coach, and receive counseling
 through an interactive web site,
 telephone, and emails.
- 3) Metformin You will receive metformin, a commonly used medication in patients with early type 2 diabetes.

Later you will attend clinic visits at 3, 6 and 12 months after entering the program.

How will you benefit?

You will receive free blood tests and blood pressure measurements.

You will receive up to \$300 for participation

You will be participating in a research program that may ultimately benefit you, your family, and other cancer survivors.
